The slippery loose stones of the steep path made the ascend very difficult.

However, these unfavourable conditions did not deter that young couple from taking their little ones with them on the hike to the Holy Mountain. If the parents wanted, I am sure, they could have found a number of options for not taking the children up on such an arduous climb. Nevertheless, their decision gave the babies an opportunity to have the fun of trekking and being at the summit of that sacred mountain.

In our lives too we may come across situations where we have options to avoid others in order to make our journey



easier. I thought of how in our lives we all meet with situations where others may be calling for help to climb the mountains of life and so often we tend to even deliberately avoid them. Are we not all Christians called to help those of our sisters and brothers of our human family who are finding the climb difficult? It may be a family member who seeks understanding, a neighbour who is lonely, a friend who is financially broken, a young person who struggles with addiction or a student who finds learning difficult.

A timely help to those in need can often provide them with an opportunity to realise their dreams and come to the summit of God's Holy Mountain.

The Anointing of the Sick



The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was administered by Frs. George and Binoy to about thirty parishioners during the noon Mass presided over by

Fr. George on Sunday, 25th June 2017, in a simple, prayerful celebration. After the priests had prayed over the people and anointed them with the Holy Oil of the Sick, the choir sang Hymns like: "Lay your hands gently upon us, let their touch render your peace....." to implore the grace from above to accomplish the grace of healing because Jesus is the healer of both body and the soul.

Parishioners of an older generation will remember this Sacrament being known as "Extreme Unction", as it was only given to those at the point of death. Thankfully, since Vatican II, this beautiful Sacrament is available to the sick and the elderly as well as to the dying and all who ask for it. May it bring to all who received it the healing they desire!

er. Reading, reflection and prayers could be shared among other family members. The prayers are designed in such a way that they begin on a Sunday and finish on a Saturday. Families are encouraged to take the statue and prayer books home on a Sunday and return them the following Sunday. We, the Sisters of St. Elizabeth are sincerely grateful to you for facilitating the sale of our crafts at your parish on Saturday 20 May, and supporting us in our challenging, yet rewarding social work. We appreciate the hospitality and love that we experienced in your very parish and we always remember you and your flock in our prayers here at the Convent. We also dare hope that we left behind good memories.

The Sisters of our Convent provide spiritual and social help to the sick and the suffering. In fact, since it was founded over 15 years ago, the Convent has been supporting more than 200 orphans with special needs. Our assistance stretches from purchasing diapers for the bedridden children to their rehabilitation and socialization. About ten years ago, the Convent established a Rehab Centre where socially vulnerable and disadvantaged people can find support, spiritual care and shelter. Today, there are about 300 people undergoing rehabilitation at the Centre.

Many of the people working at our workshops are those who lost all hope to realize their potential due to various illnesses. Together with the Sisters, they produce beautiful articles with love and prayer. By joint efforts and thanks to God's abundant mercy we support the ongoing construction of a Christian Primary School, a Church that will be available for patients of the national psychiatric hospital and develop many other charitable projects.

It is truly a blessing for us to receive support from many kind hearted people in Ireland.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Baptism takes place on the last Sunday of every month after 12 o'clock Mass.

There are three steps involved in the preparation for Baptism:

- Parents request a Baptism form from the Parish Office. When filled in, it is to be returned to the Parish Office at least four weeks before Baptism along with a copy of the child's Birth Certificate.
- A Preparation Meeting will take place at 8pm on the Wednesday evening prior to the Baptism
- The child is presented for Baptism by parents, godparents and guests.

Imagery and symbolism help describe Christ's relationship to the body of believers known as the Church. For example, the Church is called Christ's "pure bride" (2 Corinthians 11:2). St. John wrote of the Church as the New Jerusalem, "prepared as a bride adorned for her husband" (Revelation 21:2). The Church is also a "mother". "Because we receive the life of faith through the Church, she is our mother" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #169). Through Baptism, we become her children.

Al-Anon Meeting

Al-Anon offers understanding and support for families and friends of problem drinkers in an anonymous environment, whether the alcoholic is still drinking or not. This meeting takes place every Monday at 7.30 pm in the presbytery at St. Mary of the Servants, Blakestown.

Jesus gives Himself to us everyday, 365 days a year in the Holy sacrifice of the Mass. Under the humble species of bread and wine Jesus feeds us with His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity so we can live in Him, He can live in us and we can be part of the Mystical body of Christ. In Eucharistic Adoration we visit Jesus, we pay Him homage but most importantly keep Him company. Remember His poignant words to Peter, James and John "could you not watch one hour with me?".

We have been watching 1 hour every day with Jesus in Blakestown since the papal conclave of March 2013. We have been watching with Jesus in our Divine Mercy devotions every month for years. How appropriate we should watch 43 hours with Him day and night to say "Thank You Jesus for giving Yourself to us and for giving us your beautiful Mother."

The Story of Blessed Helena Stollenwerk



Helena Stollenwerk, Co-Foundress of the Missionary Sisters, Servants of the Holy Spirit.

It all began with a dream to go to China. Speaking to the parish priest and her mother she was discouraged. She even

looked for a congregation that went to China but found none. When she was 29 years old she went on a pilgrimage and heard about Arnold Janssen and his mission dream which had already come true and two priests had been sent to China. Helena found his address and wrote to him and in 1882 she met him. He was interested in starting a Congregation for Sisters if it was the Will of God. He gave her no hope for the present and only offered her a job as kitchen maid. Helena already trusted this holy man and she felt confident her dream would come true. On the 30th December 1882 her parents accompanied her to the Mission House and by 1884 there were four women longing for the foundation of a congregation for sisters. They lived an austere almost monastic life. They had constant work in the kitchen as the number of the seminarians and brothers increased. When brothers took over the kitchen the four women moved into a little old shabby house which the seminarians called 'The Convent of the Three Lindens'. Helena realised that China was too dangerous for women but the Argentinian Mission gave hope for their congregation to be founded.

In 1889 the congregation was founded and the women became postulants. They were its foundation stones, tried and tested in the crucible of waiting. In 1892 Hendrina and fourteen others became novices and Hele-

na was given the name of Maria. Sr Maria became novice directress. Slowly she realised that she was called, but that her way might not necessarily take her to China. She prepared her sisters to go to the missions and led the congregation from 1891-98. Working with Arnold Janssen they prepared the constitutions.

In 1896 Arnold founded a third congregation – Sister Servants of the Holy Spirit of Perpetual Adoration. Fr Arnold clearly wanted Sr Maria to be in that new congregation. It was very painful for her but in 1898 she left the missionary sisters and became a novice. By now the missionary sisters were 120 in number. Fr Arnold had thought that Sr Maria would become Superior General of both congregations but it was not to be. Ten months into her noviciate in the Cloistered Branch she became ill and was soon confined to bed. By January there was no hope of recovery and on the 3rd February 1900 she died. Her last words were "Jesus for you I live, Jesus for you I die"


